

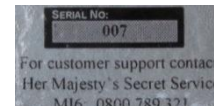
**Bayou Jumper Serial Number  
and  
Secret Agent Registration Number Application\***  
SOE Form 6-1939-00-7122/bj(4s)

It's the next best thing to a secret decoder ring – get your own secret agent number and a serial number decal for your Bayou Jumper Spy Radio. Here are the rules:

1. Serial/agent number 007 is reserved. For whom, you ask? Well, that's classified – need to know only.
2. Serial/agent numbers 001, 002, 003, 004, 005, 006, 008, and 009 have already been assigned to the first eight builders who made a two-way QSO using the Bayou Jumper spanning a distance of at least 1000 kilometers (621 miles), which is roughly the distance from London to the Norwegian agents who used the Paraset. Need not have been a Bayou Jumper – to – Bayou Jumper QSO.
3. Serial/agent numbers from 010 to 099 will be assigned to the next ninety builders who make a two-way QSO spanning at least 100 kilometers (62 miles) roughly the distance from Dover to Dunkerque. Need not be a Bayou Jumper – to – Bayou Jumper QSO.
4. Serial/agent number 099 will be reserved for the first YL operator to complete a QSO of at least 100 km, if she wishes.
5. Serial/agent numbers above 100 will be assigned to any builder requesting one, in order of receipt of request and SASE.

To request a serial/agent number, fill in the information below and send it, along with an SASE (there is no other additional cost) to:

You will receive a water transfer decal matching your version of the Bayou Jumper, similar to the ones above, bearing your Bayou Jumper serial number, as well as a certificate (suitable for framing -- if you really want to advertise that you are an official secret agent). As supplies dwindle, it may be necessary to distribute the certificates via email/PDF.

A #10 SASE with one unit of First Class postage will suffice.

If you wish your certificate to be mailed flat and unfolded, the SASE should be a 9" x 12" envelope with \$1.15 postage

Your serial/agent number will be held in the strictest of confidence, only to be disclosed under torture, or if asked for politely.

*Note: a convenient way to determine the distance is to look up the station you worked on QRZ.com, click "Details" and the distance from your QTH to the other station's QTH will be shown. 1 mile = 1.609344 km.*
